In light of this, we have been working hard, anticipating possible scenarios. One of actions we have taken is to further develop our online learning in the event of a full lockdown. As you know, every child has access to Seesaw and this will continue to be used. Additionally, we will be delivering Zoom lessons in maths, English and R.E. In the event of a full lockdown, Invitations for these lessons will be sent through Seesaw so please make sure you know your child's password. There are rules that must be followed when teaching online and these have been saved on our school webpage under the Covid-19 tab. I have also attached a copy with this newsletter. It is very important that you read these. Teaching will start at 8.55am and the children will need to be ready to learn at this time.
