Lifting of Government Restrictions

As you are aware, the majority of restrictions will lift on Monday 19th July. The requirement to self-isolate if you are contacted by NHS Test and Trace will remain in place until 16 August, when it will be <u>relaxed for people who are fully vaccinated and for the under-18s</u>. In order to help to ensure a reduction in the spread of the virus before everyone begins their holiday and consequently, to reduce the need to isolate, school will maintain the measures we have in place until we break up on Wednesday 21st July. Schools continue to receive guidance from Greater Manchester in relation to Covid restrictions. The general view is that the situation regarding schools in September will not be clear until the children are due to return. For this reason, we will maintain our extended drop off and collection times. When I receive any further clarity, I will inform you as soon as possible.

Uniform Ordering

You should have now received the information for online ordering of school uniform. There are also posters containing the information on the office window. If you haven't, please let the school office know as soon as possible. Please note, the online service will be the only way you can order school uniform - the school office will no longer have this facility.

Breakfast and After School Club

Due to bubble closures and staff isolating as a consequence, we will not be able to run either breakfast or After School Club. They will recommence in September.
