Dear families of St. Kentigern's,

### Covid-19 update

The rules relating to Covid-19 Track and Trace, together with the processes required if a child or staff member test positive for Covid -19, have changed. Please find below the new guidance:

### Tracing close contacts and isolation

Settings only needed to do contact tracing up to and including 18 July. Close contacts will now be identified via NHS Test and Trace and education settings will no longer be expected to undertake contact tracing.

As with positive cases in any other setting, NHS Test and Trace will work with the positive case and/or their parent to identify close contacts. Contacts from a school setting will only be traced by NHS Test and Trace where the positive case and/or their parent specifically identifies the individual as being a close contact. This is likely to be a small number of individuals who would be most at risk of contracting COVID-19 due to the nature of the close contact. You may be contacted in exceptional cases to help with identifying close contacts, as currently happens in managing other infectious diseases.

Individuals are not required to self-isolate if they live in the same household as someone with COVID-19, or are a close contact of someone with COVID-19, and <u>any</u> of the following apply:

- they are fully vaccinated
- they are below the age of 18 years and 6 months
- they have taken part in or are currently part of an approved COVID-19 vaccine trial
- they are not able to get vaccinated for medical reasons

Instead, they will be contacted by NHS Test and Trace, informed they have been in close contact with a positive case and advised to take a <u>PCR test</u>. We would encourage all individuals to take a PCR test if advised to do so.

This means that schools will no longer be contacting families in the event that a positive case has been identified. It also means that a class does not have to be sent home if a pupil/staff member tests positive.

As we know, Government guidance changes all the time. I will keep you informed of any updates as soon as school receives them.

# Afghanistan Refugee Collection

School have joined the Diocese in collecting essentials for the adults and children of Afghanistan who have recently arrived in Manchester. We would be grateful if you could contribute by donating toiletries such as shampoo, conditioner, toothbrushes (for children and adults) deodorants, shower gel etc. and Aptamil baby milk formula.
