<u>Back to school advice issued amid high levels of flu, COVID-19 and scarlet</u> <u>fever</u>

The Government has issued the following advice to help protect children and minimise the spread of illness in education settings and protect wider communities:

Flu and coronavirus (COVID-19) are **currently circulating at high levels** and are likely to continue to increase in coming weeks. High numbers of scarlet fever, which is caused by group A streptococcus, is also reported. Hand hygiene continues to minimise infections and if your child is unwell **and** has a fever, they should stay home from school or nursery until they feel better and the fever has resolved.
